Some Truths about Addiction and Recovery

- Addiction is a disease. It has a predictable pattern of symptoms and must be treated.
 You did not cause it, and you cannot fix it.
 However, you can learn new ways to help the person who has Substance Use Disorder.
- Recovery is a process. It is not unusual for people to begin using again after a treatment episode. Relapse can be part of getting better if lessons are learned from the experience. Persons are always encouraged to return to treatment if they are having problems.
- The addicted person will need to learn how to recover from their disease and be responsible in other areas in their life.
 Please read, "10 Ways a Family Member Can Help" for more guidance.
- Addiction takes its toll on everyone involved. It is very important that family and others take care of themselves.

 Some examples are eating well, getting enough sleep, addressing health issues, participating in activities/hobbies and getting support from others.
